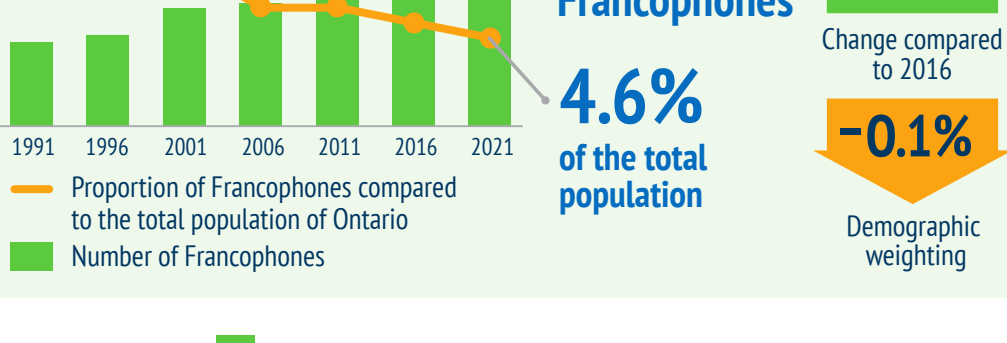

Inclusive Definition of Francophone (IDF)

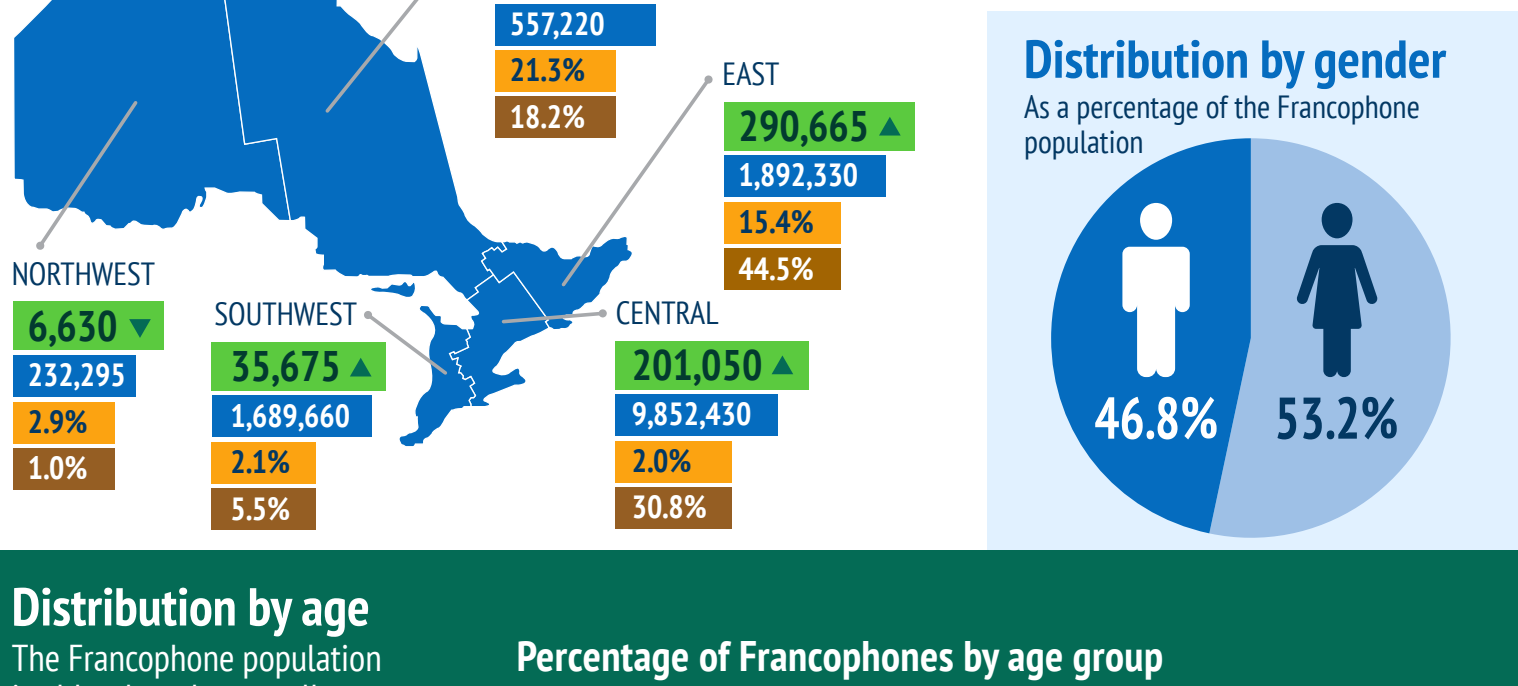
Overview of the definition used by the Ontario Government

Number and demographic proportion

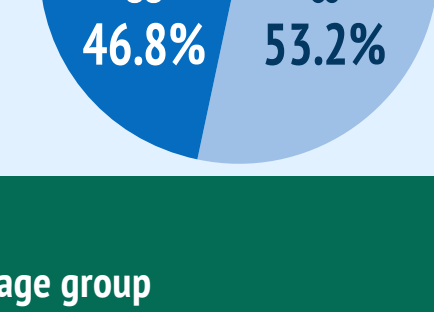


Geographic distribution

As a percentage of the Francophone population

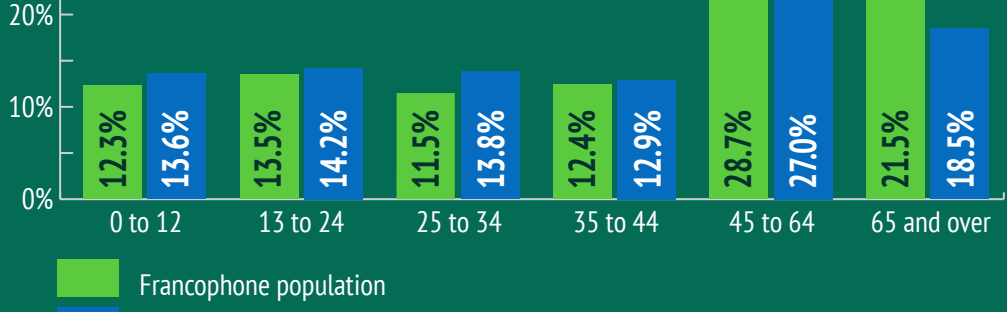


Distribution by age

The Francophone population is older than the overall Ontario population.

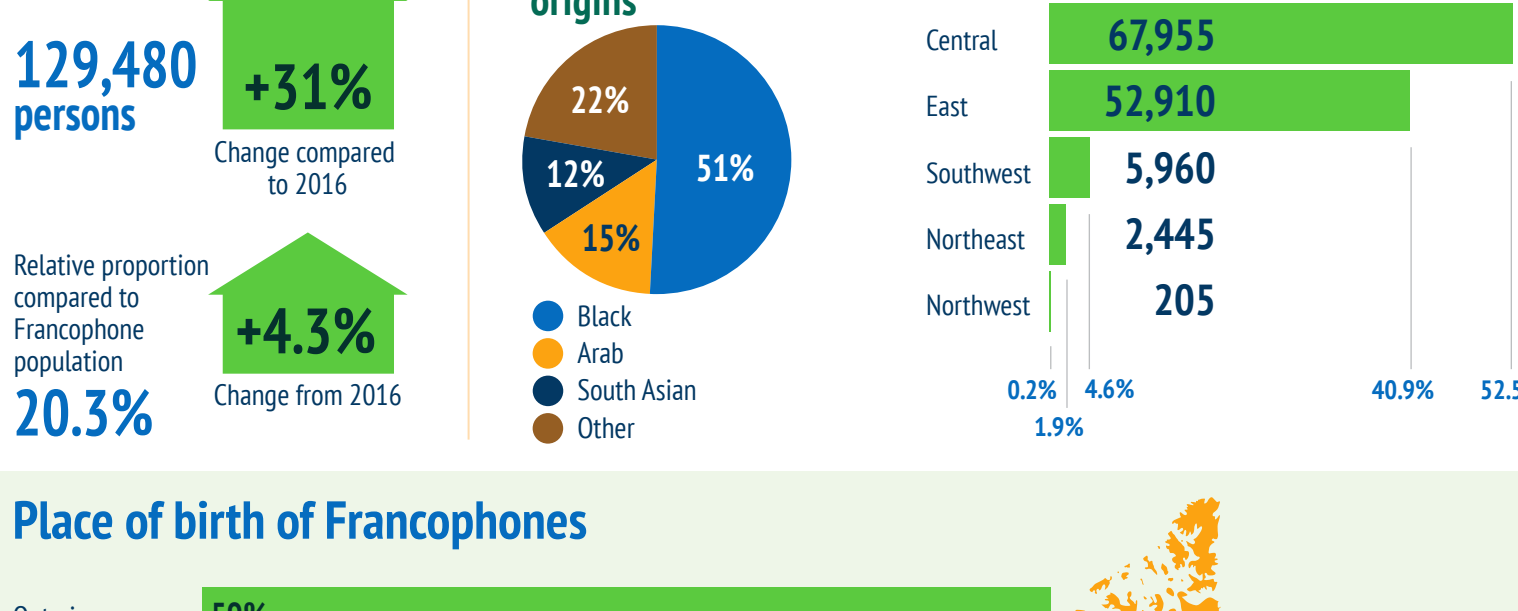

Percentage of Francophones by age group

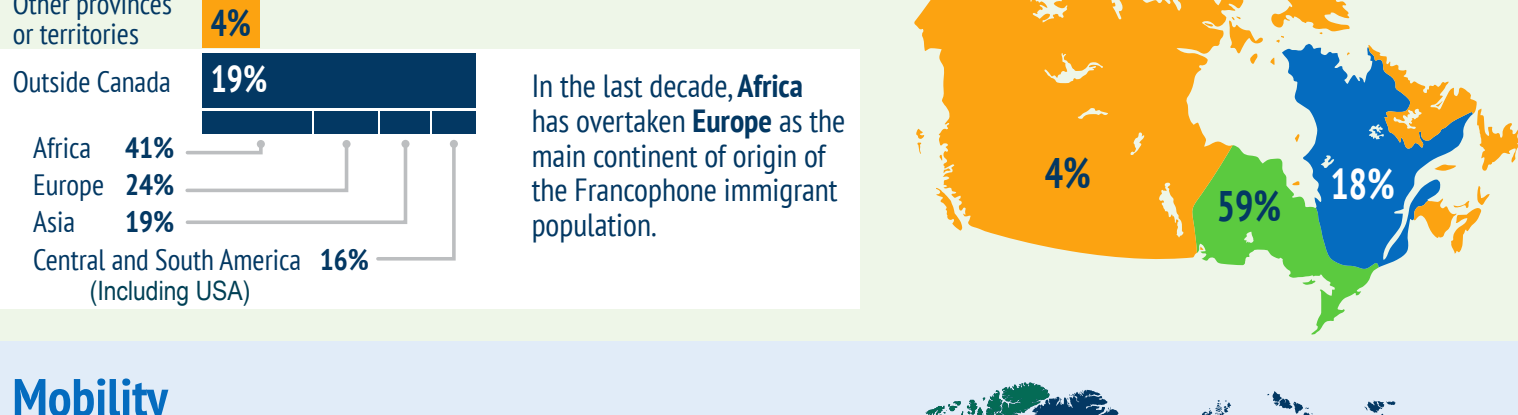


PROFILE BY BELONGING TO AN ETHNOCULTURAL COMMUNITY, PLACE OF BIRTH AND MOBILITY

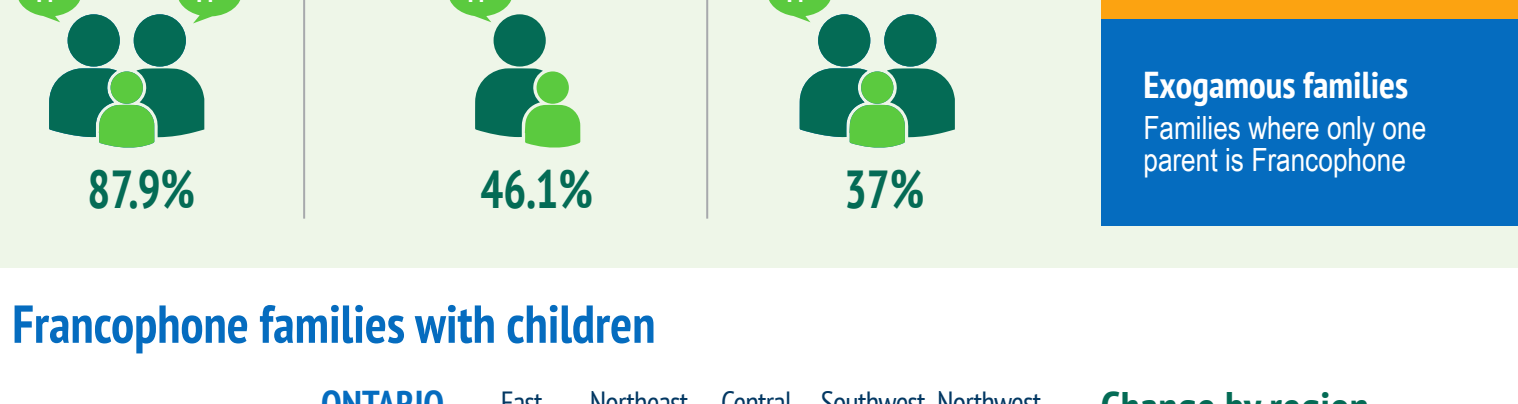
Between 2016 and 2021, 56,105 Francophones settled in Ontario.

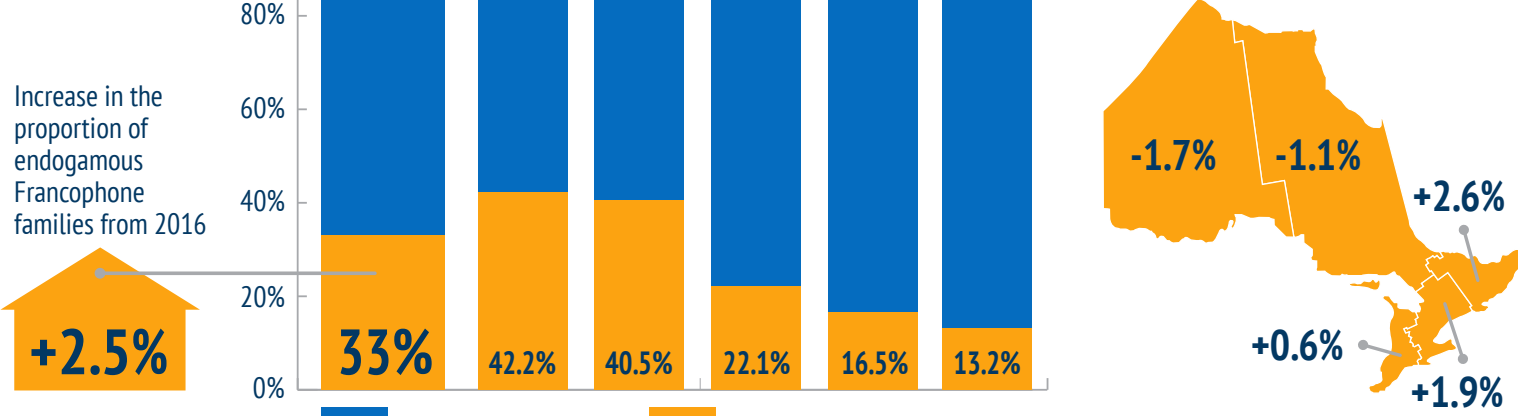


PROFILE BY USE OF FRENCH AT HOME AND AT WORK

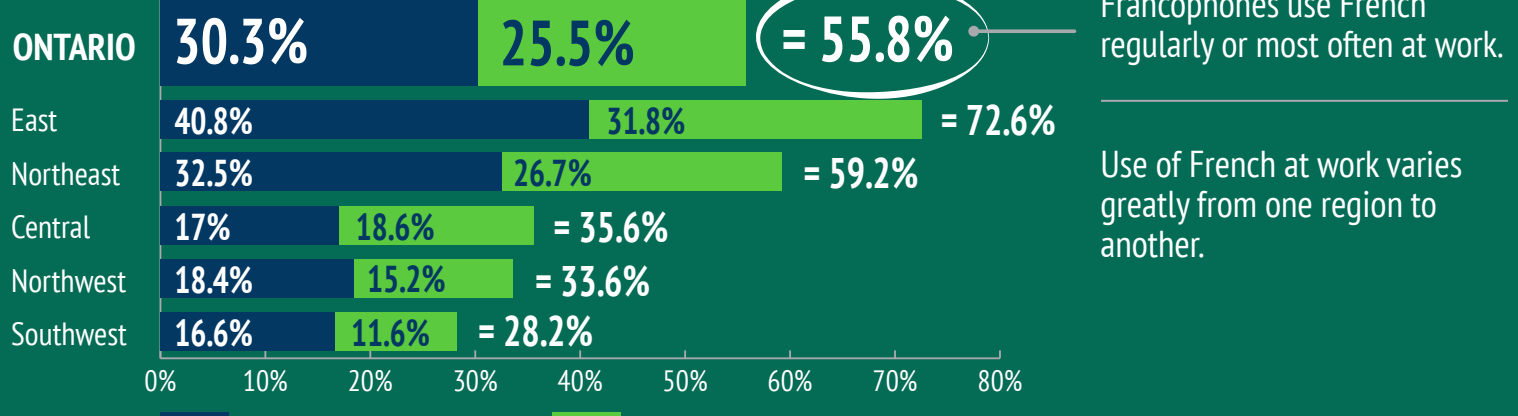
Children's retention of French

More than half of Francophones use French regularly or most often at work.

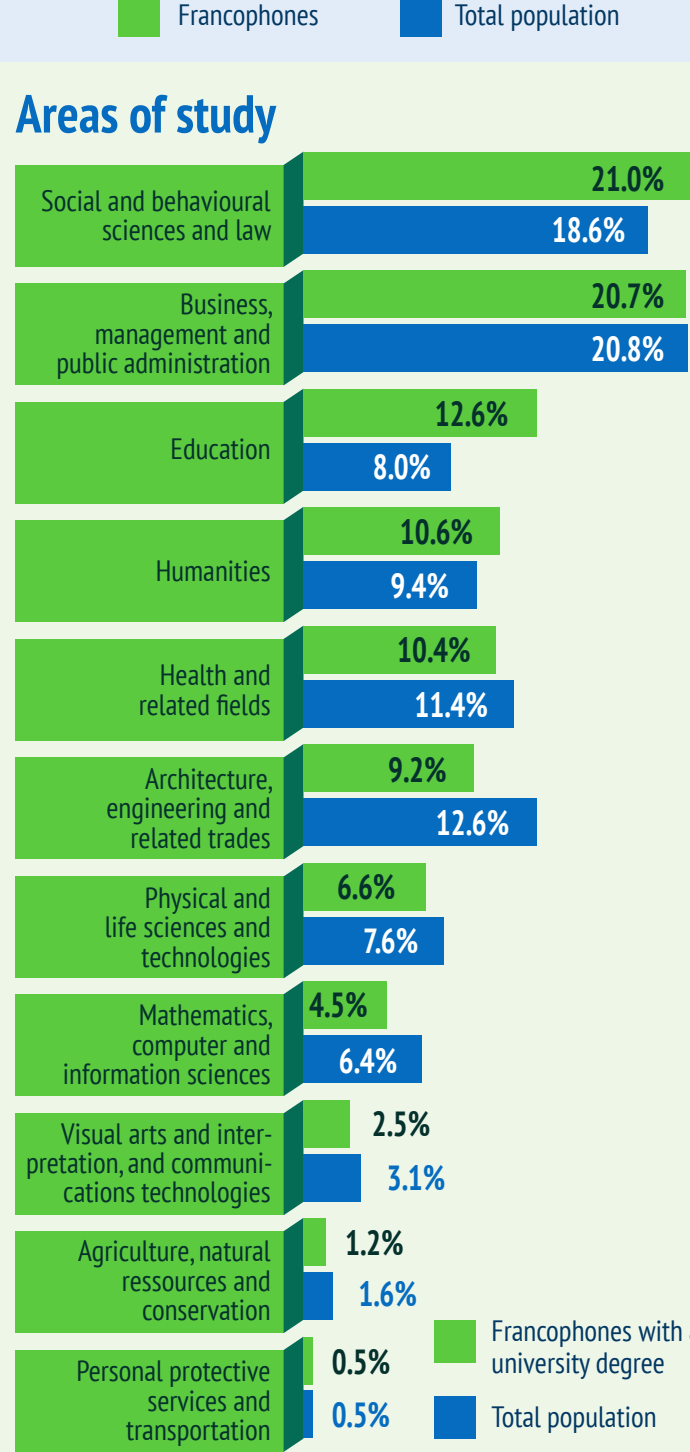
Use of French at work varies greatly from one region to another.

Highest level of education in the 25 to 64 age group

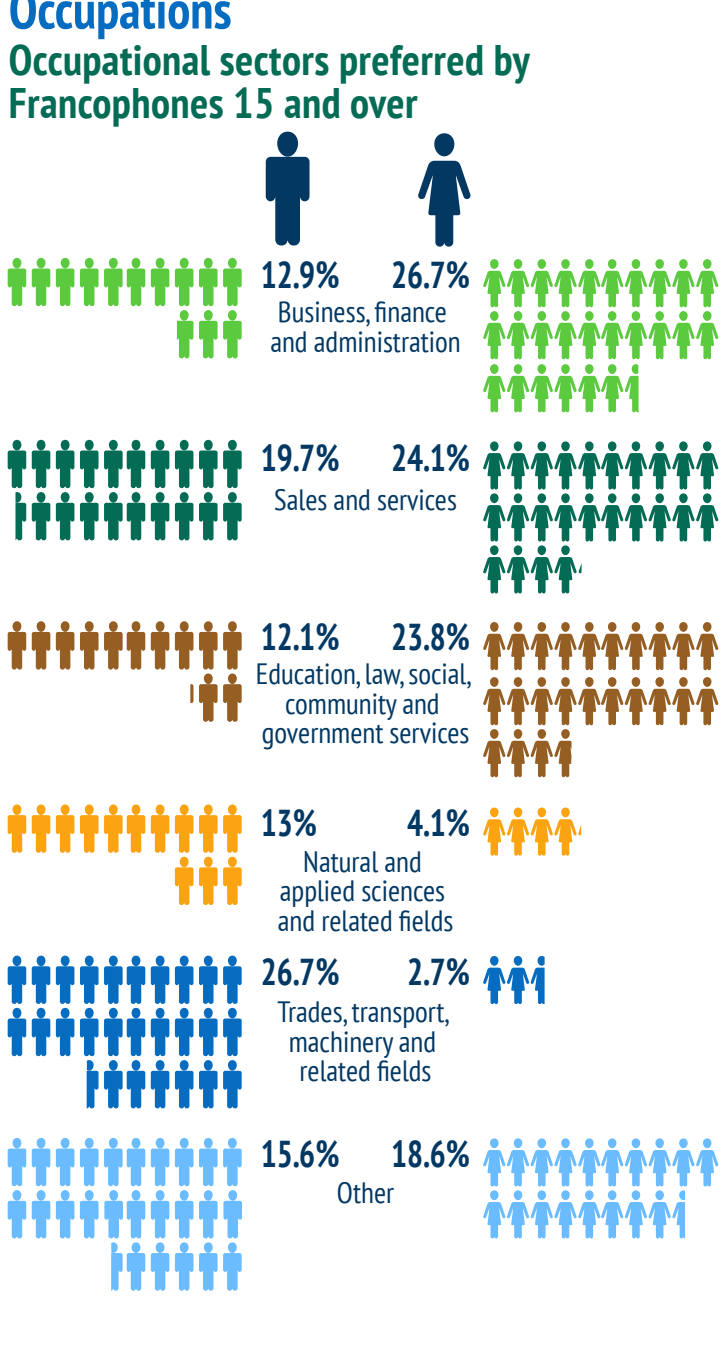

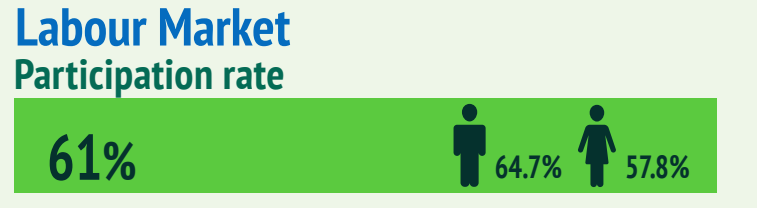

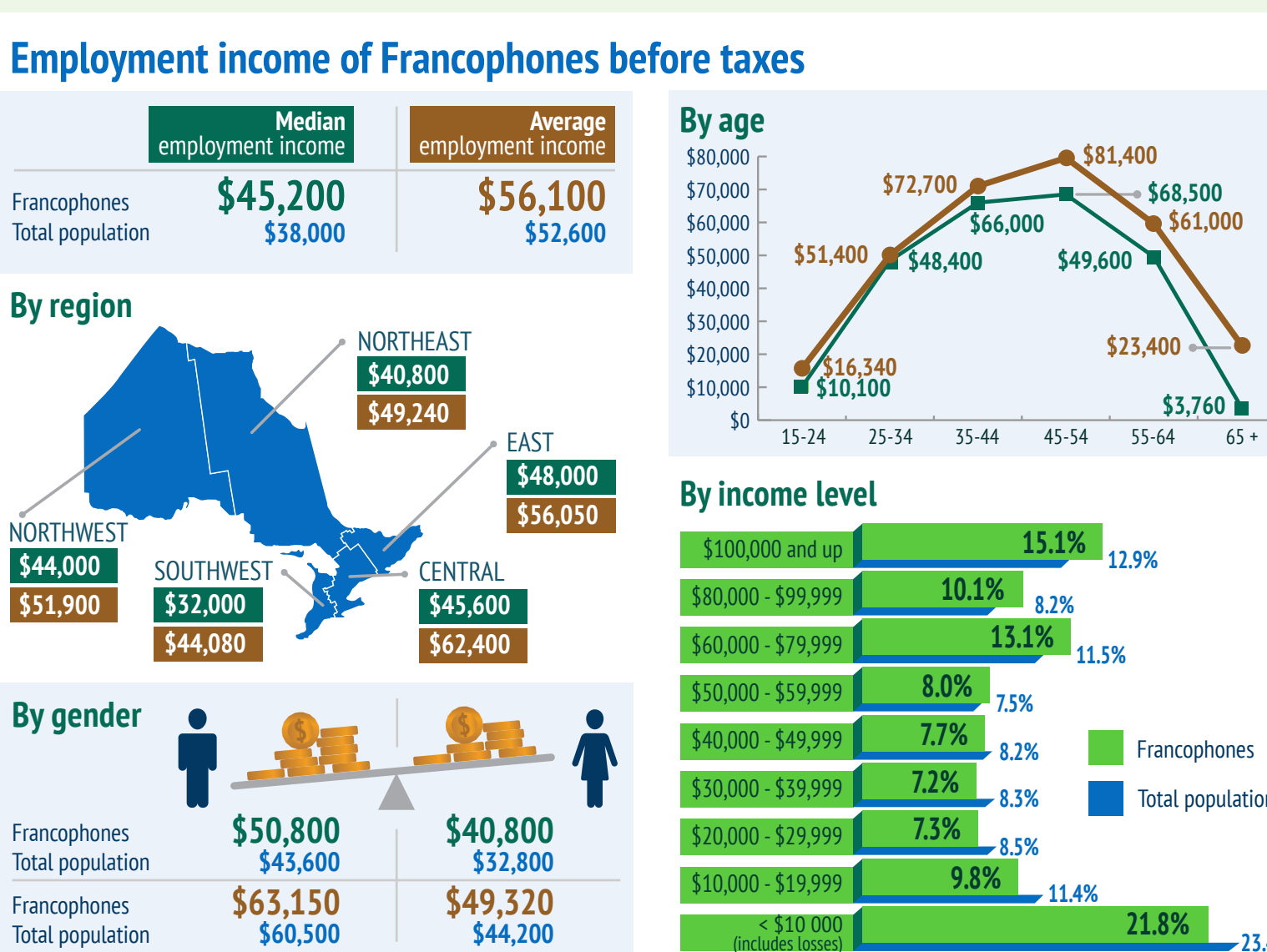
Labour Market Participation rate
