


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Welcome to KINDERGARTEN in Ontario!

Kindergarten in Ontario: A quick guide for families

Welcome to Ontario

Starting kindergarten is an exciting milestone for both you and your child. This brochure provides information to help families understand and get to know Ontario's kindergarten program. For more information, please visit ontario.ca/KindergartenReady.

What is kindergarten in Ontario?

Kindergarten is the start of school in Ontario. It is a free 2-year program for 4- and 5-year-old children. It gets your child ready for Grade 1 and sets them up to be successful.

In kindergarten, students gain::

- early reading, writing and math skills
- creativity, problem-solving and social skills

Kindergarten is optional but it's a great way to give your child a strong start.

How do I register my child?

Register at your school in January or February for your child to start school in September. Online registration and interpretation services available. Registration is also possible throughout the school year for newcomers who arrive at any time.

You will need to bring:

- proof of your child's age (birth certificate/passport)
- proof of your address (lease or utility bill)
- your child's immunization records
- · your child's baptismal certificate if you are registering in a Catholic school

Immigration status does not affect your child's eligibility.

Preparing your child for kindergarten

- Speak positively about school to help your child get excited.
- Establish routines (morning preparation, getting dressed, meals).
- Consider visiting your school before the first day. You can contact the school directly to request a visit.
- · Help your child learn to use the toilet, get dressed, and eat on their own.
- Support social skills by encouraging your child to play with other children and join community activities.
- Speak to your child's educators if you have any questions or concerns about your child's school experience.

Language support

- Ask about orientations and language supports for students and their families in school boards.
- Talk to your child's educators about how to support your child learning a new language in class and at home.
- Continue using your home language(s) with your child to support their language development.

Communicating with your school

- Talk to your child's teachers regularly.
- Ask about an interpreter and translation supports.
- Attend meetings and other events held at your school.
- Participate in volunteering opportunities and parent councils.
- Ask about parent resources on school websites.

Practical tips and safety

- Ensure your child attends school regularly and arrives on time.
- Check if you are eligible for school bus transportation or establish safe walking to and from school routines.
- Dress your child in comfortable clothing suitable for the weather and pack extra clothes.
- Learn about your school's policy about food allergens, to protect kids who get sick from certain foods.
- Pack nutritious snacks and lunches that respect this policy (for example, nutfree or peanut-free).

Get extra support

- Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS) help families understand school procedures and community resources. They are available through local YMCAs.
- ontario.ca/EarlyON: Find free drop-in programs in your community at EarlyON Child and Family Centres.
- <u>ontario.ca/SpecialEducation</u>: Special Education support services are available for children who require additional help.
