Contest steps

Select, learn, create!

1	Contest launch: October 15th.	\square
2	Put up the poster and invite students to enter.	
3	Students choose between a largemouth bass and a splake.	
4	Students learn about their selected fish e.g., habitat, colour of scales, average size.	
5	Students create their 8.5 x 11" artwork. Excluding digital art, any medium or technique of their choosing is allowed. Artwork must not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ " in total thickness.	
6	Teachers download, print and handout entry form from ontario.ca/FishArtContest.	
7	Ensure all forms have a parent or guardians' signatures.	
8	Mail in all artwork and signed forms by no later than January 2 nd . Must be post marked by this date.	
9	Winners announced March 2026.	\Box





Contest details

Eligibility

The contest is open to residents of Ontario who are currently:

- in Grades 4-12
- attending elementary, secondary or homeschool

Prizes

Winners will each receive a fishing prize pack and tickets to the Toronto Sportmen's Show during **March 2026**.

Artwork requirements

The artwork must highlight the chosen fish species in its natural habitat. All artwork must be the contestant's original, hand-made creation. Photographs, tracing and computer-generated artwork will not be accepted. You may use the medium or technique of your choosing such as, acrylics, oil, watercolour, crayon, pencil crayon, markers, collage or printmaking. Artworks must not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ " in total thickness and 8.5 x 11" in size. No lettering, signatures or initials may appear on the front of the design.

Submitting your work

The entry form and artwork submission must be postmarked and mailed to the address provided in the entry form by no later than January 2nd (late or email entries will not be accepted). Entry forms must be completed, signed by a parent guardian and attached to the artwork. Artwork will not be returned. Teachers or guardians may submit one envelope of multiple submissions from their students or individual submissions can be made.

Announcing the winners

One winner will be selected by a panel of judges for each grade category (Grades 4-6, 7-9, 10-12). The 3 winners will be contacted by March 2026. All winning entries will be displayed online at ontario.ca/FishArtContest.

The ministry retains all winning entries. By entering the contest, you consent to the use of your artwork by the ministry for promotional use after the contest closing date.







Contest details

Judging criteria

Artwork entries will be judged based on the following criteria:

Artistic expression: judges will evaluate how well the artwork demonstrates the principles of art — balance, contrast, emphasis, movement, repetition, rhythm, and unity.

Fish anatomy: judges will assess the accuracy and detail of the fish's anatomy depicted in the artwork.

Accurate habitat: judges will examine how accurately the artwork represents the fish's natural habitat.

Judging process

A panel of Fish and Wildlife Program staff will evaluate submissions and select the top artworks for each grade group using the judging criteria. The judges' selections account for 75% of the total score. The remaining 25% of the score will come from a public Facebook vote of the top 5 artworks from each grade group. The artwork with the highest combined score will win their respective grade group.

Largemouth Bass

Habitat preferences:

• Prefers warm water areas with lots of weeds.

Size:

25-55 centimetres (10-22 inches) and
0.25-2.5 kilograms (0.5-5.5 pounds).

Featured fish facts



Splake

Habitat preferences:

· Prefers deep rocky cool waters.

Size:

· 25-46 centimetres (10-18 inches) and 0.45-1.35 kilograms (1-3 pounds).
